nation some eight decades ago, the solar and eight-spindled Charkha can certainly bring out economic transformation at present,” he said, adding, “It is really a matter of concern that we don't have proper mapping for our goal for Khadi”.



Advocating for villages with complete employment through Khadi Reform Development Programme of Charkha and Production, Shri Singh said that a time has come to give up the septuagenarian model of government aids system. “We need to develop the self sustainable model, oriented to the growth of the entrepreneurs and develop entrepreneurial model,” he added.

Earlier, the KVIC Chairman Shri Vinai Kumar Saxena, in his welcome address, said that with the push given by Shri Narendra Modi, Prime Minister, Khadi has taken a leap from fashion to economic transformation in the recent past. Appealing the participants to pull up their socks to



ensure tangential growth of Khadi, Shri Saxena said that much more can be done to attract the corporate houses – with latest design intervention. “We are committed for the economic independence of our artisans. For that, we need to save 'Khadi' which is jewel and heritage of India'. Thus we need to enhance the wages of artisans who are mile stone of this Sector. And, only extensive and comprehensive marketing can ensure their economic sustenance,” he said, adding, “We are already on the job to develop one-spindle Charkha to six and eight-spindle, for finer and delicate signature fabric.”

Chairman KVIC also said that taking serious notes of Prime Minister's appeal for Sweet Revolution, KVIC had set a target of distribution of at least one lakh bee-boxes across the country till March 2018. “It will not only ensure better job opportunities for rural folk, rather it will also increase the yield of different crops in the surrounding areas,” he said. He also expressed his desire to give a lift to the training Centres and transform them into training cum production centres.

Shri Arun Kumar Panda, Secretary, MSME gave a call of paradigm shift in the way of



functioning and redressal changes. To transform life of artisans should be the motive of all the States and Field offices, and they should pull their sleeves to give the results. New Year Bonanza for office bearers of Khadi institutions

New Delhi: Much on success mantra of corporate giants 'Give the best to get the best', Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) has taken a historic decision after its inception in 1956. Yes, taking serious notes of the low profitability of the Khadi Institutions (KIs) due to the low remuneration of its office bearers, i.e. Secretaries and Chairmen, the KVIC has decided to increase their salary/remuneration linking with the turnover/sales performance of each KI from 1st January 2018. It would not only make them economically strengthened, rather it would also inspire them to yield the best to get the best.

Giving this information, KVIC Chairman V. K. Saxena said that at present, except few Khadi Institutions, most of them pay very meager amount of remuneration to its office bearers – ranging from Rs 5,000 to Rs 10,000 per month. “It was the need of the hour to connect their salary/remuneration with the sales performance of their respective KIs. It will act as a morale booster for them to work hard for an overall improvement of the institutions,” he said, adding, “Most of the profitability is blocked in the form of large inventories and sundry debtors. Low remuneration also opens up ways for the office bearers to use unfair means to earn extra money from the KIs, to meet out their house hold expenditure.”

Not only that, it would also encourage everyone from artisan to office bearers to give their best to increase their income and consequently increasing the employment opportunities.

The KVIC Chairman further informed that this issue was discussed on many occasions at various forms including with the Minister of MSME Shri Giriraj Singh and it was unanimously proposed to give proper increase in their monthly remuneration of Secretaries and Chairmen of KIs.

It may be noted that in a recent meeting of Khadi federation/Institutions on 16th December at Gandhi Darshan in New Delhi, their representatives

hailed the suggestion of the KVIC Chairman and admitted that Chairman's approach would certainly boost the morale of the office bearers and subsequently increase the profitability and productivity of the institutions.

"The monthly remuneration proposed varies from RS 15,000 to RS 90,000 per month with respect to the turnover of the Khadi Institutions ranging from Rs 50 lakh to Rs 5 crores and above. The institutions with lower turnover will now enthusiastically approach to make it doubled or tripled as it would directly proportional to their performance. Similarly, the federation members agreed that value addition in the products will not affect the pricing in any manner," Mr Saxena added. Similarly members of the board of Khadi institutions will also get Rs 1000 per sitting, which has also been started for the very first time.

It may be noted that there are altogether 2600 KIs, of which number of institutions having annual turnover of less than Rs 50 lakh and between 50 lakh and 1 crore are 1274 and 388 respectively. With this moral boosting remuneration bonanza, it is all set that in the coming years; almost 50 percent institutions would try to achieve the higher circuit, which would automatically increase the turnover of the Khadi to a new height.

Third Meeting of the National Co-ordination Committee



Third meeting of the National Co-ordination Committee was held on December 14, 2017 at All India Institute of Local Self Government, Mumbai. The meeting was participated by 30 Members and Special Invitees in addition to the bearers of Khadi Commission Karmachari Union and Officers' Association. Shri K.S. Rao and Shri Y.K. Baramtikar, Dy. CEOs participated from KVIC side.

Shri K.K. Gupta, Chairman, of the AIKPWA, welcomed the Commission's Nominees, Retired Jt. CEOs/Dy. CEOs, Committee Members from Mumbai as well as State Units of Rajasthan, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Wardha besides other special invitees.

Chairman, AIKPWA, briefed the participants about major ongoing issues like 7th CPC for Pensioners/Family Pensioners of KVIC, providing Group Health Insurance cover for KVIC Pensioners/Family Pensioners, issue of involving services of retired officials by the KVIC, providing adequate space for Association Office etc.

Addressing the participants Shri K.S. Rao, Dy. CEO (Admn.), informed that (a) as per the information, the 7th CPC file has to go to Finance Ministry. He as well as Administration Directorate are pursuing the matter for

early sanction. (b) On being informed by Shri Vijay Kumar, about the difficulties being faced by retired officers due to non availability of TA Advance and local hospitality, for personal presence in the CBI courts as a prosecution witness in CBI cases, he informed that he will look into the matter and try to mitigate the hardship. (c) On the issue of personal grievances of individual pensioners, he suggested that the Association may compile all such issues and submit to KVIC as a consolidate proposal for faster disposal of all such issues on time bound manner. He also informed that it is proposed to nominate an officer as "Nodal Officer" to attend to the issues of Pensioners. (d) In so far as engaging retired employees is concerned, he informed that the issue of suitability of remuneration offered is under examination and possibility of enhancing the same from Rs.20,000/- to Rs.40,000/- in case of

officers of the rank of Director and above (pre-retirement) and Rs.20,000/- below thereof is under consideration.

Shri Y.K. Baramatikar, Dy. CEO (PMEGP/VI/WZ), informed about status of 7th CPC.

Secretary of the AIKPWA, while summing up the deliberations, added that the Association is already pursuing the cases of covering Pensioners/Family Pensioners under CS(MA) at par with serving employees through amendment in the KVIC Regulations and also payment of Pension through Treasury to mitigate the hardships being faced in Pension Payment/Revision. The Commission will also be requested again to extend the support for State level units of Pensioners Association for their day-to-day functioning.

The meeting concluded with suggestions on 7th CPC pursuance, Medical Assistance to Pensioners /Family Pensioners under CSMA, the assistances

/benefits extended to serving employees should be simultaneously extended to Pensioners/Family Pensioners, to take up digitization of the individual records/files of all the Pensioners/Family Pensioners as early as possible and provide certified copy of service book to each of the Pensioner/Family Pensioner on payment of permissible fee of Rs.500/- as applicable now.

In order to meaningfully utilize expertise of able pensioners/family pensioners for the social welfare purpose, a separate independent NGO should be created.
